We also had 53 children and young people's questionnaires returned; we will add the data from them to the website when it is ready.











'Other' breaks down to 11 working from home, 4 train, 1 by scooter, 1 by van. I have redrawn the pie chart to show this.








E1: Would you support a Conservation Area in Axmouth Village?


E2: Would you want overhead cables buried?

E3: Are you confident that the drainage infrastructure is sufficiently robust and adequately maintained?






F2: Is it important for you that the village development boundary is kept tightly drawn, with development beyond this not permitted?


F3: Would you be in favour of a small (6-8) development of affordable homes within the parish for local people, if there were a proven need?










I1: Where do you do your main food and household shopping?

275 respondents (81%) prefer to buy local produce 19 (4%) don't and 44 (13%) did not reply.

















Not much difference for L2 (speed) but due to lower response rate for L3 makes a big difference.






L4: Does Axmouth need a bypass?





M1: Where do you consider the footways alongside the roads are inadequate?




I looked at the Boshill Cross to Village Gateway for the Stedcombe respondents. 12/23 (52%) thought this was inadequate.


M2: Where do you feel unsafe on a bicyle?










M3: If one of the following were provided between the Village and Seaton, would you use them?






M4: Which destinations would you like to reach by a frequent and direct bus?




